Responsibilities:

Processing fish at large fish traps to collect Chinook salmon and steelhead trout migration data. The incumbent will assist with trap operations, debris removal, and data entry. One trap is located on the Snake River near Lewiston and one is located on the Salmon River near White Bird. The incumbent will work mainly in Lewiston but will also assist at the White Bird fish trap as needed. Room and board are provided for the White Bird trap location. Room and board are **not** provided while working in Lewiston (Local housing options are listed on Craigslist). Night and weekend work will be required.
